Course Description

This intensive training program empowers primary care clinicians (PCCs) to assess, treat and manage common mental health concerns among pediatric patients within their practice. This program is being offered over the course of four sessions and is presented by Project TEACH’s team of child and adolescent psychiatrists along with pediatricians and family practice clinicians. This program is designed to provide practical information that is specific to PCCs. While medication management will be addressed, a comprehensive approach to treatment will be discussed.

- Present and discuss cases from your practice.
- Ask questions, including any follow-up questions from the training.
- Discuss site-specific strategies & resources to help overcome barriers to providing mental health treatment in your practice.
