If you’re a resident who aims to practice primary care pediatrics, but don’t know how and where to begin, please read on!

There exists a very informative lecture series from the AAP, which may be able to help you! “Sailing into Practice”¹ is a lecture series that deals with transitioning from residency to primary care practice. These lectures are given by co-founders Dr. Marc Lashley² and Dr. Brad Fell, who are also co-chairmen of the Chapter 2 (District II) Residents’ Needs Committee.

“It all started in 2000,” says Dr. Lashley “as a means to reach out to the Chapter 2 pediatric residents and encourage them to join the AAP.” Since then, the series has successfully continued on, and has been occurring bi-annually.

The first course is held in the fall/winter, and explores how to choose the right pediatric practice after residency. The residents are presented with introductory questions such as, “What kind of practice do you want? What are you looking for?” followed by pointers on how to find a practice, how to evaluate job offers (call, size, money, hospitals, insurance, etc), how to win contract negotiations (money, malpractice, tail insurance, etc), and other important questions that you should ask a potential employer.

To supplement this lecture is an attorney who comes in and gives legal advice about employment contracts. A brief Q&A portion then follows. The second course is held in the spring, and tackles the basics of Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) coding. This course ends with sample cases that allow the residents to practice their newly found knowledge in coding. Both courses are conveniently held after-hours, as dinner meetings. Invitations are sent out to the program directors of the 11 teaching programs within Chapter 2, for them to send their second and third year residents to attend. On occasion, Dr. Lashley and Dr. Fell have also been invited to give lectures during AAP resident section meetings.

“[It was] a nice evening with a lot of good information,” comments Christopher Strother, who attended the “Choosing A Practice” Course at the AAP Resident Section Annual Assembly in 2007 as the chairperson for the residents’ section. “Marc has been a great asset for the residents in his chapter for years now. The residents are happy to have someone in the AAP spend so much time and energy, helping them with an issue that can be so difficult for so many residents. It’s a great role for the AAP to provide education for residents outside of what they ordinarily get in their residency curriculum.”

Since its founding more than seven years ago, “Sailing into Practice” has continued to stand out as a testament to the generous support that the Academy provides its younger colleagues. Residents have remained very grateful and receptive to this educational experience that prepares them for “the nuts and bolts of the real world,” with high hopes of encountering nothing but “clear, blue skies and smooth sailing ahead” as they begin their journey into pediatric practice.

Resident Initiative Fund International Elective Awards

Each academic year the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) will have a minimum of twelve, five-hundred dollar (\$500.00) awards to be given in **two cycles** (number awarded per cycle will be at the discretion of the review committee) to categorical or combined-training pediatric residents who wish to complete a clinical pediatric elective in the developing world during residency. Awards are given solely on the basis of the application and an accompanying letter from the applicant's program director. The selection committee is composed of members from the AAP Section on International Child Health and the AAP Section on Medical Students, Residents and Fellowship Trainees.

The International Elective Awards will be given within two cycles, due **September 15** and **March 15**. Recipients of the September cycle will be notified by November 30 and recipients of the March cycle will be notified by May 31 each year. The online application will be available year round at
